Wait times in hospital emergency rooms are sometimes worsened by patients who could be better served at non-urgent care facilities. While every patient must assess their level of urgency, the following guide may help.

When to go to the nearest Emergency Department:

- Pain or tightness in the chest
- Severe pain
- Shortness of breath
- Fractured or broken bone(s)
- Stroke symptoms: sudden severe headache or weakness; vision problems; numbness and/or tingling in the face, arm or leg; trouble speaking; or dizziness
- Child has persistent diarrhea and vomiting
- Baby has a fever above 38.5°C (101°F)
- Mental health issues

When to consider using Non-Urgent Care clinics:

- Cuts or wounds that may need stitches
- Sprains, strains or deep bruises
- Mild asthma attacks
- Ear infections
- Urinary tract infections
- Cough, congestion, sore throat, fever
- Insect bites, rashes
